At the conference the results of the "Report on Research and Education Cooperations (RECs) in Europe" and a catalogue of Good Practice Examples of REC are provided for discussion. The conference introduces established cooperation models and new and experimental forms of cooperation. Outstanding porjects present their experiences in an interactive exhibition.

The objectives of the conference are to:

- discuss REC as a new approach in science education and to compare different cooperation models,
- jointly reflect on quality criteria for different forms of REC,
- outline strategies about how to implement REC into a modern education and science system on a broader basis and to
- discuss recommendations for policy makers and stake holders.

Workshop 1: What are good practices of Research Education Cooperation (REC)?

In many countries we already find initiatives trying to improve science education through collaboration with research institutions. The variety of these initiatives is impressive: Some of them are very successful; others seem to be less effective. In this workshop we want to discuss the success criteria for good and effective cooperation. What exactly could »good« mean? What exactly could »effective« mean? The basis for this exchange will be the experiences and expectations of the participants. The workshop will be dedicated to research education collaborators who want

to share and discuss their experiences and to encourage participants looking for

Workshop 2: How to realise good cooperation projects?

In most RECs quite a number of people are involved: teachers, pupils, school leaders, researchers and last but not least promoters and sponsors. These people have different objectives, play different roles and contribute different competencies. They communicate in different ways and have to work under specific constraints.

In this workshop we want to talk about the realisation of REC and how to define roles within a REC. Which kind of guidelines might be helpful for designing and carrying out successful projects?

Workshop 3: Could a REC be an element of modern science education?

RECs - found all over Europe - bear the potential to improve science education and show great promise as a measure against the declining interest among young people for science. They offer a vision of how modern teaching and learning strategies for improving science education.

What is this vision like? In what way are RECs an adequate element of a changing system of science education in Europe? The workshop will give the opportunity to discuss under what conditions RECs fully exploit their potential in bringing about necessary improvements.

Workshop 4: How to use a single REC project to move the system?

Nearly all collaboration projects start with the idea of one single visionary teacher or researcher. These are the pioneers of RECs. The crucial - yet unsolved - question is how successful cooperation models could look like and be implemented on a broader basis.

Workshop 4 will be dedicated to the discussion of strategies of how to proceed from a single successful project to an innovation of the system. How can initiators of RECs connect their projects to education policies and reform programmes and how can REC promoters contribute to meet this challenge?





Call for Posters

At the conference, the results of our international report on Research and Education Cooperation projects (RECs) in Europe and a preliminary catalogue of Good Practice REC-Examples will be presented. Furthermore, quality criteria, guidelines and recommendations for successful RECs will be discussed.
